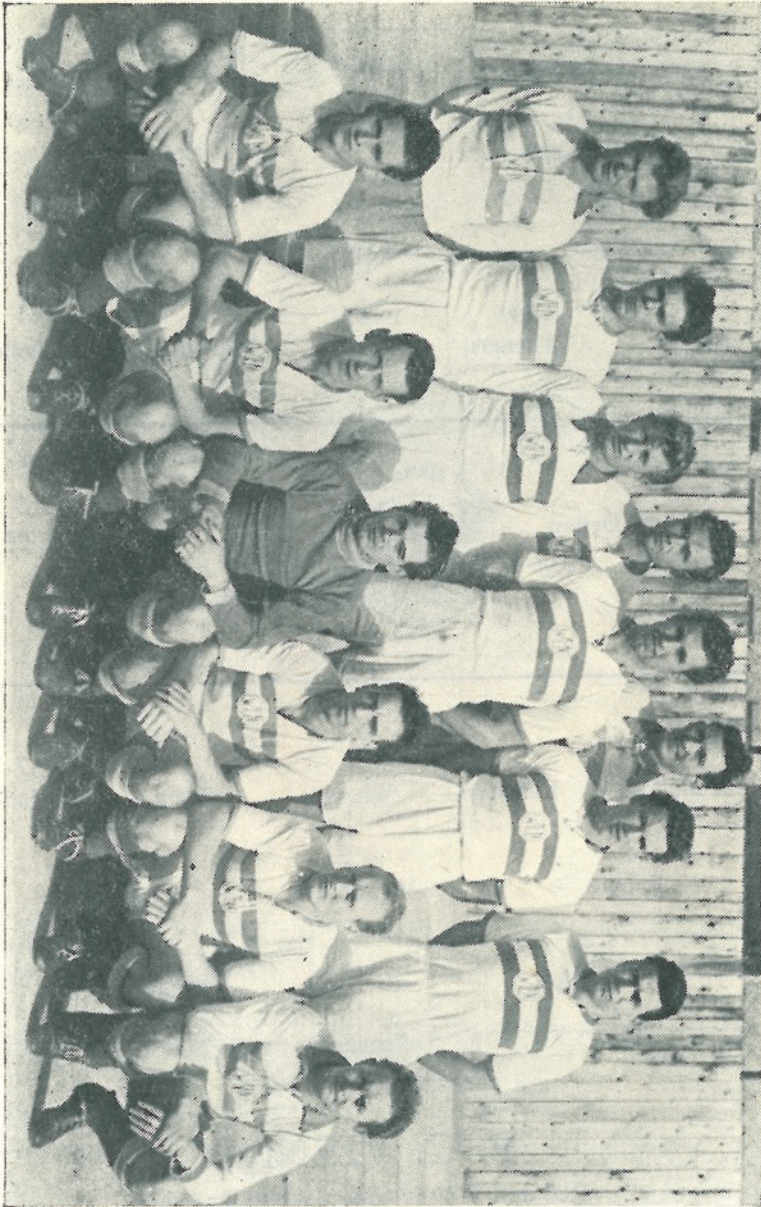

CLUB NOTES

Good evening, Ladies and Gentlemen.

Tonight it gives us great pleasure to welcome our Continental visitors F.C. Vienna to Selhurst Park.

We shall no doubt see this side excel in ball control and short passing, but the failure of most Continental sides (excepting Wembley, of course) has been their shooting ability.

Most touring sides from Austria in the past have favoured the attacking centre half as a sixth forward, and, if this is the case, it will be interesting to watch the contrasting style of the two teams.

This is the last match of the tour, and although in results it has not quite gone their way, we hope that the standard of football over here has suitably impressed them.

F.C. Vienna was founded in 1913 for that famous English sportsman, Mr. Nicholson, and were then known as F.C. Nicholson until 1923. From 1928 the club has been in the First Division, which is in the highest Austrian football class.

Barring injuries, in tonight's game they should be fielding six internationals. In Vienna football circles they are generally known as the "Austrian Football Mill," for there has been more than one complete national team which has come from this famous club, who so far have played with great success in Germany, France, Norway, Switzerland and other countries on the Continent.

Here is the result of their tour in this country to date : Vienna have lost to Watford 1—0 ; lost to Swindon 3—2 ; drawn at Weymouth 1—1 and to Exeter 0—0 ; and in last Saturday's game were beaten 4—0 by Rotherham. So undoubtedly they will make a big effort to record their first win of their tour.
